urray State University has an exciting new selection of classes for this year's summer art workshop. S.A.W. is a hands-on workshop that will cover the elements of art and explore four distinctly different mediums in one week's time. Students will work independently and collaboratively to produce one-of-a-kind works of art and expand upon their knowledge of studio and art history.

This year's workshop will focus on drawing, printmaking, animation and sculpture. The Art History lectures will be part of the evening activities and combined with the exhibition spaces at MSU. At the end of the workshop the students will display the work they made for parents, faculty, and workshop participants.

THE 2013 SUMMER ART WORKSHOP SESSIONS

Sculpture with Cody Arnall: An introduction to the materials, tools and techniques used in sculptures. Students will learn basic 3D skills while having the opportunity to design and build a custom work of art.

Animation with Jim Bryant: A quick study in the basic principles of animation in bringing an object to life through the mechanics of motion. Areas of focus include basic movement, squash and stretch, bounce, and multiple objects in motion. Animation will be done using Flash software on Macintosh computers.

Quick Prints with Blake Sanders: In this course hand-drawn and digitally rendered imagery will be used in conjunction to produce an edition of prints. Lithographic "smart plates" will be used as an accessible, flexible introduction to printmaking and the print studio. Students will also collaborate by combining plates to create unique monoprints.

The Urban Figure with Hannah Sanders: An introduction to figure drawing with explorations in urban installation. Students will work in dry media both independently and collaboratively on large, nontraditional surfaces.

Art History with Dr. Peggy Schrock: Historical Narratives: Portraits in Context. Why understanding artists and patrons of the past matters today— old and new ways to look at our "self".

Art History with Dr. Zbynek Smetana: POWER OF ART. Images and art have been used to address its audiences with unprecedented effectiveness throughout history. This talk will look at some of the reasons why we are so susceptible to visual communication.

The sessions are designed to provide challenging and informational experiences for first time participants and those who have previously attended. No high school art experience is required to attend this workshop. It is a fast paced, cumulative learning experience for rising 9th grade students through recent high school graduates.

Monday- Friday: June 3-June 7, 2013: Daily Sessions Morning 9:00am-12:00pm/Afternoon 1:30pm-4:30pm. Evening activities and presentations will be held every evening from 6-9pm.

WHAT TO BRING

Students must bring bedding, including single bed sheets, blanket, pillow, towel and washcloth. Students should also bring old clothes suitable for studio art sessions. Students will have access to a swimming pool, and should bring a swimsuit and towel if they are interested in swimming.

Students may bring sketchbooks if they currently have them, and any drawing material they have and would like to bring. Students may also want to have a small amount of spending money for the week.

In May, registered program participants will receive additional information: directions to Murray State's Curris Center; a medical treatment form; workshop information; and a guidelines brochure.
