

Set in the 1990s, *Never Let Me Go* weaves the tale of three young people enrolled in a mysterious, even bizarre, English boarding school called Hailsham. The rules are strange and the teachers even more so as we explore the lives of Kathy, Ruth and Tommy. To say more would spoil the suspense of this gripping novel.

Once again this year, the MSU Reading Experience committee has lined up a great series of events related to the novel—a printmaking session, a poetry workshop and a film festival, to name a few—and tied to our theme for 2012-2013, "Humanity and the Humanities."
