CALL TO ORDER: Staff Congress President Audrey Neal called the meeting to order.

REPORTS FROM SPECIAL GUESTS PRESENT:

Dr. Ron K. Patterson, University President: Dr. Ron Patterson gave an update on the Provost search. Candidates will be on campus March 2, 3, and 4. He encouraged staff to attend the candidate town halls and provide feedback. Dr. Patterson provided an update on the Kentucky Legislative Session. A budget town hall will be held in March. The School of Veterinary Medicine at Murray State has been approved. The AI chatbot platform EdSights was launched on February 17.

Dr. Laura Foltz, Vice President of Finance and Administrative Services: Dr. Laura Foltz said an announcement was made last week that travel requests no longer require approval from vice presidents. Details of the procedural change can be found in the *Updated Travel Procedures* email from Finance and Administrative Services that was sent to employees on February 13. Other processes are being evaluated for improvements to increase efficiency. Dr. Foltz said she welcomes input. Her office has been meeting with Dr. Patterson regarding the budget.

Dr. Don Robertson, Vice President of Student Affairs: Dr. Don Robertson discussed the career fairs being held February 17 and 18. He complimented Career Services staff for their work arranging the career fairs. Dr. Robertson gave an update on enrollment for the spring and fall 2026 semesters and for Racer Nation Orientation.

Haley Stedelin, Associate Director of Human Resources: Haley Stedelin said cholesterol screenings are being held on campus on February 17 and 18. All the appointments have been filled. She thanked Murray Calloway County Hospital for providing the screenings. Job audits are in the process of being conducted. Staff can contact Human Resources with questions. Performance evaluations will begin soon. Training sessions for performance evaluations will be offered. The *Great Colleges to Work for* survey will send an email to some employees asking for feedback.

Dedrick Brooks said the registration form has been completed and the email addresses have been submitted for the *Great Colleges to Work for* survey. Emails will be sent to random employee email addresses approximately March 2-27.

President Neal said an email will be sent to Staff Congress representatives to send to their constituents to remind them to complete the *Great Colleges to Work for* survey if they receive the email with the survey link.

Staff Regent Report: Staff Regent Dr. David Wilson said the Board of Regents will meet on February 27. He will send the meeting link to staff. He thanked staff with Sodexo, SSC, Housing, and Facilities Management for their work during the weather closure. The Staff Survey is open until February 27.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Abby Hensley made a motion to approve the January 21, 2026 Meeting Minutes. BJ Johnson seconded. President Neal asked if there were any corrections to the minutes. Hearing none, she called for the vote. The motion carried.

Approval of December 2025 and January 2026 Treasurer's Reports: Tressa Ross made a motion to approve the December 2025 and January 2026 Treasurer's Reports. Trish Lofton seconded. President Neal asked if there was any discussion. Hearing none, she called for the vote. The motion carried.

Executive Committee: President Neal reported on the February meeting of the Executive Committee.
