CALL TO ORDER: Staff Congress President Marion Hale called the meeting to order.

REPORTS FROM SPECIAL GUESTS:

<u>Dr. Bob Jackson, University President</u>: Dr. Bob Jackson welcomed everyone back to campus for the new year and new semester. He said he recently returned from meetings in Frankfort regarding pension funding and university funding. Dr. Jackson gave an update on the outsourcing of custodial and grounds positions. He said a Work/Life Balance Committee has been formed. He answered questions.

<u>Jackie Dudley, Vice President, Finance and Administrative Services</u>: Jackie Dudley reminded employees to refer students to Racer One Stop in the Curris Center through January 17. She said students can receive refunds electronically. I-9 Forms for student hires will now be completed by the Student Employment Office rather than by the individual departments which employ the student workers. The I-9 Forms and background checks must be completed before students can begin employment.

<u>Joyce Gordon, Director of Human Resources</u>: Joyce Gordon said she received notification that Anthem and Murray-Calloway County Hospital have reached an agreement. MCCH will remain an in-network provider for MSU Anthem health insurance. Human Resources is providing support for employees affected by outsourcing. She spoke about events for the Wellness Pledge and financial wellness.

Marty Anderson asked if full-time employees will be affected by the termination of tuition waivers in 2021. Ms. Gordon answered that the tuition waivers will terminate on June 30, 2021, for only part-time employees unless action is taken by the Board of Regents. She added that any employee with concerns can contact Human Resources.
