CALL TO ORDER: Staff Congress President Marion Hale called the meeting to order.

REPORTS FROM SPECIAL GUESTS:

<u>Dr. Bob Jackson, University President:</u> Dr. Bob Jackson reported on his recent trip to Frankfort. Currently, no funding cuts for the university have been announced. Murray State Administration is watching the pension proposals that are being developed in the Kentucky House of Representatives. The Board of Regents will meet on February 28. The Shared Governance Committee will meet on February 25. Staff Congress member Jessica Evans is a member of the Shared Governance Committee.

Laura Buchanan said she appreciated the Governor's comments at MSU on February 17. Dr. Jackson noted that individuals may contact their legislative representatives to comment on issues. The legislative session will end on or before midnight on April 15. Dr. Jackson answered questions.

Joyce Gordon, Director of Human Resources: Joyce Gordon said that during the first week of March, employees will receive information regarding performance evaluations. A comprehensive training for administrative assistants is scheduled for February 25. Racer Wellness and the College of Business are collaborating to develop financial wellness Lunch and Learn Events. Human Resources continues to work with employees affected by outsourcing. A full exit interview will be conducted with each affected employee. Spring health fair plans are in-development.

She listed universities in Kentucky which have bereavement policies that include grandparents and grandchildren as immediate family members. Orville Herndon made a motion to refer to the University-wide Faculty and Staff Insurance and Benefits Committee the request to add grandparents and grandchildren to the list of immediate family members in the Funeral Leave Policy. Trish Lofton seconded. Staff Congress President Marion Hale asked if there was any discussion. Marty Anderson said that staff have asked him about adding nieces and nephews to the Funeral Leave Policy. The current policy lists uncles and aunts as "close relative[s]" but does not include nieces and nephews as "close relative[s]".

Joyce Gordon noted that the university Funeral Leave Policy has not been reviewed in-depth for some time. Additional discussion followed. Marion Hale called for the question and the motion carried.

Marion Hale said that due to spring break, the next Staff Congress meeting will be held on March 11.
