# The "Racers" Originally, all of Murray State's athletic teams were known as the Thoroughbreds, which came from love for thoroughbred racing throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Unfortunately, the lengthy nickname didn't fit well with newspaper headline writers, so they used shortened versions like T-Breds, 'Breds, Race Horses and Racers instead. Around the late 1950's, the shorter moniker of Racers became the generally accepted nickname for Murray

Freshmen and sophomores who are not exempt from housing regulations by virtue of age, military service or other approved exemptions must reside in University housing during the regular semester.


All freshmen and sophomores, unless exempt from University housing, will be assigned the All Access meal plan.






Six-Year Graduation Rate for First-Time, Full-Time, Baccalaureate Degree-Seeking Students Entering Fall 2013: **54.5**%






#### Grant Awards From 07/01/19-06/30/20 By PSC Code
