Murray State University earns reaffirmation of accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges

Murray State University has earned reaffirmation of its accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). The new 10-year accreditation was a rigorous multi-year effort and process led by the Office of the Provost and involved numerous academic and administrative areas across the University to present a profile of the institution and demonstrate compliance with all SACSCOC standards and requirements. The process culminated in a multi-day campus visit by a SACSCOC review team this past spring.

This is the second consecutive 10-year reaffirmation in which there were no recommendations given by SACSCOC to Murray State.

"Murray State University received its first accreditation in 1928. Since that time, it has cultivated a tradition of excellence through the development and enhancement of its programs, services and resources," said SACSCOC liaison and Associate Provost Dr. Bob Pervine. "It is because of this diligence that Murray State University has consistently upheld all accreditation requirements and standards presented by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges. Murray State University is, first and foremost, committed to the success of its students, which makes the reaffirmation process a top priority."

Dr. Aaron Thompson, president of the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE), was awarded an honorary doctorate from Murray State University as part of the fall 2024 commencement ceremony on Dec. 14.

Thompson is a passionate advocate for higher education. As a first-generation college student from rural Clay County, Kentucky, he experienced first-hand the transformative power of a college credential. As president of the CPE, he works to ensure all Kentuckians have an equal opportunity to improve their lives through postsecondary education.

Before taking the helm of CPE, Thompson served as interim president of Kentucky State University; CPE executive vice president and provost; and faculty member and administrator at Eastern Kentucky University. He has extensive leadership experience within

the private and non-profit sectors and is a highly sought-after national speaker. Thompson has authored or co-authored numerous books and peer-reviewed publications on diversity, cultural competence, first-year experience programs, retention and student success, among other topics.

Thompson received his doctoral degree in sociology from the University of Kentucky, with an emphasis on organizational leadership. He earned a master's degree in industrial sociology from the University of Kentucky, and a bachelor's degree in political science from Eastern Kentucky University. He also holds honorary doctorates from Brescia University, Eastern Kentucky University and Union College.

Medley is the late father of Murray State alumna Whitney Medley Bechtel. A graduate from the Murray State University class of 2006, Whitney Bechtel, her husband Dr. Brett Bechtel and her

late parents Patrick and Karen, have generously supported the University ever since Whitney enrolled more than 20 years ago. Through Whitney's experience as a Murray State student, her parents became avid Racer fans and contributed to the University's Parents Fund for many years even after her graduation. In 2022, the Bechtels established a scholarship for theatre students in memory of Whitney's mother, who loved theatre and acting.

More recently, the Bechtels made a new generous gift to the University to establish the Patrick J. Medley Veteran Scholarship to assist student veterans pursuing degrees in science and engineering.

 departments and residential colleges the opportunity to welcome alumni home and to give the public a snapshot look at all they have to offer.



FAFSA 2025


Implemented the 2025-26 Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) communication plan to promote the FAFSA opening.

Registered Student Organizations

Web Management partnered with Kade Gambill, Student Activities Coordinator in the Center for Student Involvement, to develop a better way to display the list of Registered Student Organizations. We have over 140 registered organizations. Information about the organizations were included in a pdf that had to be updated and reuploaded often. The pdf was not searchable or user-friendly. The most challenging aspect of the project was creating the list in a format that provided a better user experience while being easy and manageable to update.

After a lot of trial and error, we found a way to convert a spreadsheet into data that could be uploaded through the CMS that would populate a mobile-friendly table on the website. Organizations are alphabetized automatically and can be sorted based on name or category. The list is also searchable. Clicking on an organization name opens a section for more details including contact information for the president and advisor.


We updated the Open Enrollment Quick Guide for Human Resources.

We designed and assembled the annual holiday direct mail campaign for the Office of Development.






Birthday Cards
