Murray State University surpasses \$100 million goal in historic Be Bold: Forever Blue & Gold Centennial Campaign

Murray State University proudly announces that it has surpassed its ambitious \$100 million goal in the Be Bold: Forever Blue & Gold Centennial Campaign, marking a transformative moment in the University's history. The campaign, designed to propel Murray State into its second century, has focused on two critical areas: student access and support and academic excellence, coupled with strategic campus modernization, including support for Racer Athletics.

Launched in 2018 during the tenure of Dr. Bob Jackson as the 14th President of Murray State University, the campaign began with a silent phase, laying the groundwork for its success. A comprehensive Campaign Readiness Study conducted in 2021-22 affirmed the University's ability to achieve this milestone, and subsequent years of extraordinary donor support have made it a reality.

The Murray State University
Foundation, Inc. will steward the
majority of campaign gifts on behalf
of the University, ensuring they create
lasting benefits for students, faculty
and programs.

To date, the campaign has secured over \$50 million in pledges and commitments, with more than \$51 million in gifts already collected. Since its inception, nearly 25,000 donors have contributed more than 110,000 gifts, underscoring the broad and passionate support for Murray State's vision.

Though the goal has been met, the Be Bold: Forever Blue & Gold Centennial Campaign will continue to accept gifts through June 30, 2025, ensuring that even more students, programs and campus initiatives benefit from this extraordinary effort.

Murray State University Board of Regents announces new nursing building to be named Jackson Hall in honor of Dr. Bob and Karen Jackson

Construction on Murray State University's new nursing building has begun, and on Dec. 13, 2024, the University's Board of Regents announced that the new building will be named the Robert L and Karen Miller Jackson School of Nursing and Health Professions Building, "Jackson Hall," in tribute to the legacy that both President and Mrs. Jackson have left to Murray State's nursing program and the University as a whole

The Board recognized that during Dr. Jackson's tenure as Murray State's 14th President from 2018 through 2025, he led the University through a historic period of growth, change and innovation. With a unique vision for Murray State's future, Jackson achieved record-breaking support from both public and private sources for transformative campus improvements, the strengthening of academic and athletic programs and tremendous increases in resources for student assistance. He spearheaded state-funded projects, including a new Veterinary Sciences building, Learning Commons/Residence Hall, a new School of Nursing and Health Professions building and added bronze statues to campus to recognize and honor Racer One and Murray State's first President, Dr. John W. Carr. He initiated and carried out the preservation and improvement of historic campus facilities such as Lovett Auditorium, Wrather Hall and the Curris Center. He guided



the University through the COVID-19 pandemic, transitioned its athletic programs to the Missouri Valley Conference and Missouri Valley Football Conference and oversaw the \$100 million centennial capital campaign, Be Bold: Forever Blue and Gold.

Mrs. Jackson is a second-generation graduate of Murray State, earning a bachelor's degree in nursing. Her years of clinical focus were pediatrics and intensive care nursing. During her time as Murray State's First Lady and throughout the global pandemic, she devoted her time and nursing skills to the regional vaccination clinic held on campus. In recognition of her extraordinary contributions, she was honored with the COVID-19 Hero Award in 2021 by the College of Education and Human Services. She has remained an active alumna of her sorority, Alpha Sigma Alpha, serving on their advisory board for 30 years.

Dr. Ron K. Patterson named Murray State University President

The Murray State University Board of Regents Presidential Search Committee has

announced Dr. Ron K. Patterson as Murray State University President. Currently Chadron State College President, Patterson will commence his role as the 15th President of Murray State on July 1, 2025. He will succeed President Dr. Bob Jackson, who will retire on June 30, 2025. The selection of Patterson follows an extensive process and national search.

Patterson serves as president of Chadron State College, one of three state college institutions within the Nebraska State College System and an institution with approximately 2,300 students and 600 full-time faculty and staff. In his role, Patterson launched and chaired the college's new five-year

strategic plan, established strategic enrollment partnerships, commenced new academic programs and partnerships, furthered external relationships with federal, state and local government leaders, and fostered an environment of success within the college's Division II athletic programs.

Patterson earned a Doctor of Education in Higher Education Administration and Leadership at Creighton University, an Education Specialist degree with a concentration in Community College Administration at Arkansas State University, a Master of Arts at Marietta College, a Bachelor of Science at the University of Tennessee – Southern and an Associate of Arts at Northeast Mississippi Community College. He recently completed professional development offered by the American Academic Leadership Institute and Penn State University's Academic Leadership Academy for Academic Administration.

Patterson hails from Corinth, Mississippi. He and his wife, Jenny, have two children, Olivia and Braylon.

2025 Kentucky legislative session includes continued support to pursue a School of Veterinary Medicine

Murray State University's exploration of a School of Veterinary Medicine received a strong showing of support in the 2025 Kentucky legislative session.

Senate Bill 77, which was passed unanimously by both chambers in a bipartisan manner and was signed into law by Governor Andy Beshear, continues to provide a path forward for the University to establish a new Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine at Murray State.

Murray State holds multiple existing assets on its campus, as well as a new \$60 million Veterinary Sciences Building to be constructed. The University's Hutson School of Agriculture has the largest estimated pre-veterinary medicine/veterinary technology enrollment of any university in Kentucky, and is just one of three programs in Kentucky that is fully accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association.


