

## KENTUCKY NEW TEACHER SURVEY

### CAEP Standard 4.2, 4.3, 4.4

The Kentucky Education Professional Standards Board (EPSB) disseminates a Kentucky Teacher Standard-aligned *New Teacher Survey* to interns and resource teachers participating in the Kentucky Teacher Internship Program. The purpose of the survey is to ascertain responders' perceptions about the quality of interns' preparation programs. Surveys were distributed annually from 2001-2008. EPSB administered the surveys every other year in 2009 and 2011. Then EPSB distributed surveys fall 2013 and spring 2014. In fall 2015, EPSB will begin administering the survey each year. In 2011 the EPSB added two additional items to rate candidates' preparedness to work with children with special needs and limited English proficiency. Additional, non-KTS items were added to the fall 2013 survey. The 2011 survey included principals for one year only. EPSB intends to survey principals once again beginning fall 2015. The Kentucky EPSB has stated their intention to administer the New Teacher Survey annually beginning fall 2016.

New Teacher Survey respondents rate interns' progress toward meeting Kentucky Teacher Standards on a 4-point Likert scale: 1 (poor), 2 (fair), good (3), and 4 (excellent). This artifact captures 2013-2014 survey data at the state level and longitudinal data at the provider level.

### *State Level Data*

The *Kentucky Interns* table compares 2013-2014 aggregated for recent graduates (KTIP interns) of Kentucky state universities. Data reflect the percentages of favorable responses regarding candidates' preparedness to demonstrate each of the Kentucky Teacher Standards. Data were gleaned from the Kentucky Education Professional Standards board website.

Results indicated that, compared to the overall Kentucky EPP results, the provider's completers demonstrated lower rates of acceptable responses for each area. The Selected Improvement Plan seeks to implement significant strategies that will result in a more positive response from Interns.

***Provider-Level Longitudinal Data***

No ratings were available for spring 2014 due to low response rates. To capture more recent survey information, the provider gained permission to administer the same survey to 2014-15 KTIP interns and resource teachers. This survey did not yield reportable data, however, due to the low response rate. The *New Teacher Survey of Interns and Resource Teachers* table depicts the ratings for interns/resource teachers. Please note that state means first became available fall 2013 as a point of comparison.
