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NOTE: All Music courses required for the degree must be completed with the grade of "C" or better.

FOOTNOTES

- 1. Admission to this degree program is conditional for the first year. Continuation in the program is dependent upon advice of the applied teacher and departmental chair after assessment of performance talent, achievement and general musicianship.
- 2. Six (6) successful semesters of MUS 101 Recital Assembly are required. To successfully complete the course each semester the student must gain credit for 10 approved recitals and have no more than one absence from required assembly programs.
- 3. Applied music is studied at two or three credits in the first two semesters and three credits in semesters three through eight. Periodic jury and proficiency examinations are required. A half-recital (MUS 398) is required in the junior year and a full recital (MUS 498) is required in the senior year.
- 4. Concurrent with each semester of applied study, students are required to enroll in a major performing ensemble involving a student's applied major instrument. Additional semesters of study require concurrent participation in major ensembles.

COURSE SEQUENCES

All applied lessons require a "C" or better to continue in the sequence.

MUS 170, MUS 173, MUS 270, MUS 273 must be taken in sequence, with a "C" or better to continue in the sequence.

MUS 171, MUS 174, MUS 271, MUS 274 must be taken in sequence, with a "C" or better to continue in the sequence.

MUS 172, MUS 175, MUS 272, MUS 275 must be taken in sequence, with a "C" or better to continue in the sequence.

MUS 381 must be taken first in the Music History Sequence, and the grade of "C" or better is required to continue in the sequence.

MUS 382 & MUS 383 may be taken in any order.
