ALUMNI

OUTSTANDING ALUMNUS

The 2018 Outstanding Agriculture Alumnus award was presented to Mr. Stan Brunston and Mr. Kyle Yancey during the 2018 Agriculture Alumni Association's Dean's Circle Luncheon held in conjunction with MSU Homecoming activities.

Mr. Brunston attended Ballard Memorial High School as a young man, spending his spare time working on his family's farm. He started his college career as an accounting student at what was then known as Paducah Community College before transferring to Murray State University and changing his major to agricultural business.



During his time at Murray State, Brunston completed student teaching at Christian County High School and worked 15 hour per week with the University's hogs. He ultimately graduated with his bachelor's

degree in 1976.

Later that same year, Brunston began working for PCA as a loan officer in LaCenter, Kentucky. As he continued to earn promotions within the company, Brunston helped initiate a merge in the 1980s between PCA and the local Federal Land Bank. The merged company became known as Jackson Purchase ACA, which Brunston ultimately became president and CEO of in 2006. Then in 2012, the company merged with Chattanooga ACA to become River Valley AgCredit.

Brunston retired from River Valley AgCredit in December 2015 and now resides in Calloway County with his wife Tammy.

In support of Murray State's Agriculture programs, Brunston led River Valley AgCredit in providing ongoing financial support for the Student Award Banquet and the Agriculture Alumni Picnic, ensuring the annual events remain free to all attendees. He also served on the ACRES campaign committee that led to the Hutson School of Agriculture expanding through the acquirement of the Hutson Farm.

Mr. Yancey was born and raised in Ballard County and graduated from Murray State University in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in agricultural business. Following his time at the University, Yancey began working with the Jackson Purchase ACA. He started as a loan officer with the company in 2006 and continued to rise through the organization's ranks. In 2016, a few years after Jackson Purchase ACA merged with Chattanooga ACA to form River Valley AgCredit, Yancey became the company's president and CEO.

Yancey, his wife Marissa and their son Tatum live in Kevil, Kentucky. In addition to Yancey's work with River Valley AgCredit, he is a director on the Graves County Economic Development Board.

In support of Murray State and the Hutson School of Agriculture, Yancey regularly attends career fairs and banquets at the University, promoting sever River Valley AgCredit intiatives and starting a new internship program for students. He also helped establish a River Valley ACA Fund for Excellence that allows for the implementation of many new and expanded projects in the Hutson School of Agriculture.

OUTSTANDING YOUNG ALUMNUS

The 2018 Outstanding Young Agriculture Alumnus award was presented to Dr. Sheila Wilson Phillips during the 2018 Agriculture Alumni Association's Dean's Circle Luncheon held in conjunction with MSU Homecoming activities. The Outstanding Young Alumnus Award is given each year to a Murray State Agriculture alumnus who has excelled in their career and graduated a minimum of 10 year prior to the time of selection.

Dr. Phillips, originally from Owen County, graduated from Murray State with a bachelor's degree in agriculture in 2011. As a Murray State student, Phillips served on the Agriculture Leadership Council and was the chair of the Agriculture Ambassadors organization in 2011. She was a member of the Alpha Zeta agriculture honor society and Sigma Alpha professional agriculture sorority, where she served as alumni coordinator and scholarship chair. Additionally, she was a member of Block and Bridle, where she held many offices and even organized a "Wild West Tour" that allowed 30 student members and two advisors to tour farms and agriculture production facilities across the Midwest.



Phillips also received numerous awards as a student, including the Agriculture Leadership Award, Outstanding Senior Woman in Agriculture, and Outstanding Senior in Pre-Veterinary Medicine. She was named a 2011 Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges recipient and graduated as an Honors student and presidential scholar.

Following her 2011 graduation from Murray State, Phillips went on to earn her doctorate in veterinary medicine from Auburn University. She now works at Trigg County Veterinary Clinic.

Phillips has remained an enduring supporter of Murray State and the Hutson School of Agriculture as a member of the University's Alumni Association and Young Alumni Council. Most recently, Phillips and her husband Jeremy established and endowed the Wilson Phillips Excellence in Pre-Veterinary Medicine Scholarship to assist students in obtaining an education to prepare for a career in the field of veterinary medicine.

- **Dr. David Ferguson** has collaborated with BASF on a Max Wheat Yield project to test wheat with various combinations of high nitrogen fertilization, plant growth regulator applications, and multiple fungicide applications. In addition, he has completed various soybean research trials as part of the Kentucky Soybean Variety Performance Tests.

BREATHITT VETERINARY CENTER





The Breathitt Veterinary Center (BVC), located almost 60 miles away from main campus in Hopkinsville, KY is an important unit of the Hutson School of Agriculture. The BVC serves veterinary clinics and veterinarians far beyond the geographic portion of Kentucky where it is situated. In addition, the lab works with the MSU Animal Health Technology program to educate AHT and preveterinary medicine students.

The BVC is fully accredited for all animal species by the American Association of Veterinary Laboratory Diagnosticians (AALD). It is the mission of the BVC to provide rapid, accurate diagnostic data that enables veterinarians to make appropriate treatment decisions. The BVC is part of an interdependent team composed of the animal owner, veterinarian, and diagnostic laboratory dedicated to the efficient production of safe animal products to the consumers of Kentucky.

- BVC staff completed Biosecurity Level 3 Training in December 2018. The BSL 3 team will support local, state, and federal veterinarians with their diagnostic testing needs for pathogenic zoonotic diseases.
- The BVC is expanded its services into the food safety area to help meet the needs of local meat processing plants in need of high quality laboratory testing
- The Virology Section has established in-house testing for Chronic Wasting
 Disease in deer to help meet the needs of both farmers and wildlife offic ers. The Virology team completed the required proficiency tests and was
 given final approval to run the tests in early 2019.
- The Microbiology lab completed validation of the new MALDI-TOF microorganism identification system. This equipment provides much more rapid identification of bacteria and fungal organisms than traditional culture and biochemical testing.
- The DNA lab received new pieces of equipment and validated the testing methods on them. Most of these replace aging equipment with faster and more efficient methods.
- The BVC performed a total of 165,466 tests as part of 22,005 cases during FY 2018-2019

WM. BILL CHERRY EXPO CENTER



Completed in 1976 and dedicated on May 21, 1977, the Western Kentucky Livestock Show and Exposition Center was built in response to requests by the Western Kentucky Horseman's Association, Purebred Livestock Associations and various friends of Murray and Western Kentucky. The facility was renamed in honor of its first director, William "Bill" Cherry, in 2006. The Cherry Expo Center complex is made up of a multi-purpose event facility that consists of a 23,000 square-foot dirt floor arena with graduated seating for 2,714; an 8,647 square-foot staging area with a 6 stall wash rack; a 100 seat classroom; 20 station RV electrical hookup area; and dedicated detached 40 stall barn. Since the initial dedication, over 500,000 individuals have attended a wide array of

Fall on the Farm strives to provide both an educational and entertaining agricultural experience to children and adults. Over 1,200 students representing 49 high schools from Kentucky, Tennessee, and Illinois competed in events including livestock judging, tractor driving, tobacco judging, nursery and floriculture contests, seed and weed identification, small engines, goat tying, roping, auctioneering and horsemanship. In addition, FFA Field Day hosts the Kentucky State Poultry Judging Contest. Graves County High School received top honors in the State Poultry Contest, and Caldwell County was named overall Sweepstakes Champion for the third consecutive year.

INSTITUTE FOR FUTURE AGRICULTURE LEADERS

The Hutson School of Agriculture hosted the Institute for Future Agricultural Leaders (IFAL) Conference June 16-20, 2019. IFAL is a five day leadership conference for high school seniors sponsored by Kentucky Farm Bureau. Thirty-eight students from across the state attended this year's IFAL, where they participated in team building and leadership development exercises. Participants traveled to Ft. Campbell, KY to participate in team building exercises at the Outdoor Recreation Challenge Course and visited Lowe Farms in Murray to learn how MSU Alumnus Scott Lowe and his family have succeeded as first generation farmers. Students also worked together to research current agriculture issues and prepare for a Discussion Meet modeled after the annual KFB contest. Other activities included a photo scavenger hunt highlighting MSU campus landmarks, Barnyard Olympics, a special presentation by Missy Jenkins-Smith, victim of the 1997 Heath High School shooting, and an opportunity to meet with Hutson School of Agriculture faculty, staff, and MSU Office of Recruitment personnel to get a firsthand account of college life at Murray State.

STUDY ÅBROAD BELIZE MAY 12-20, 2019

One characteristic of a Murray State graduate is to have some understanding of cultural diversity and alternative economic and political systems. On May 12 -20, fourteen Hutson School of Agriculture students and three faculty participated in an agricultural and cultural tour of Belize. Students were quickly immersed in the culture of Belize through the sites and people, who were very welcoming. Program participants visited a wide variety of agricultural business and production areas where they were able to interact with producers and business managers. Sites visited include Tower Hill Sugar Factory, a sugarcane farm, a citrus and pineapple farm, Bunches of Fun Banana Farm, Mennonite poultry producers, Dis Da Fi Wi Chikin, the University of Belize agriculture campus. In addition, participants were able to meet with a marine biologist to discuss the effects of Sargassum, a representative from the Banana Grower's Association, and staff from the Belize Agriculture Health Authority. Cultural experiences included lunch with a local family in their home, a 6km nature hike at Cockscomb Basin, Xunantunich Mayan Ruins, a canoe tour in Mayan caves, shopping in San Ignacio, and snorkeling.



HUTSON SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE RETENTION - ALL NEW FRESHMEN


