RESOLUTION OF APPRECIATION TO MURRAY STATE ADMINISTRATION FOR KEEPING CAMPUS OPEN FOR IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION AND ACTIVITIES & RESPONSE TO SEVERE STORMS IN OUR REGION

WHEREAS: Murray State University's vaccination rate has nearly doubled since the beginning of the

2021-2022 SGA Administration

WHEREAS: Students report a *voluntary* vaccination rate of 65.4% and a *voluntary* employee

vaccination rate of 70.6%, which is 12 percentage points above what is expected from

CDC data

WHEREAS: Murray State University continues to host vaccination and booster clinics on campus

WHEREAS: Students and employees continue to utilize campus clinics to receive COVID-19 vaccines

and booster shots

WHEREAS: Murray State continues to actively listen and follow the guidance of healthcare experts

and epidemiologists, and continues to require individuals to wear masks indoors in all

Murray State buildings

WHEREAS: Healthcare experts claim that vaccination is the best method to combat the spread of

COVID-19

WHEREAS: The Student Government Association is dedicated to having our campus remain in-person

for instruction, student activities, and community activities while keeping our campus

safe and healthy
