## SGA CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSAL

Date: August 27, 2025

### Current Statement

#### ARTICLE VII. VOTING AND CONSTITUENCIES

Section 1. Any student enrolled in a college shall have the privilege of voting for Senate positions representing that college, all S.G.A. officer positions, at-large Senate positions. Any student with a freshman classification or with less than 30 credit hours earned after high school graduation may have the privilege of voting for the "freshman senators."

Section 2. The primary constituency of S.G.A. officers, at-large Senators and students on the Campus Activities Board shall be all students in the university. The primary constituency of a Senator representing a university or residential college or school shall be students in that college. The primary constituency of the "freshman senators" shall be the freshman class.

### Revised Statement

#### ARTICLE VII. VOTING AND CONSTITUENCIES

Section 1. Any student enrolled in a college shall have the privilege of voting for Senate positions representing that college, all S.G.A. officer positions, at-large Senate positions. Any student with a freshman classification or with less than 30 credit hours earned after high school graduation may have the privilege of voting for the "freshman senators."

Section 2. The primary constituency of S.G.A. officers, at-large Senators and students on the Campus Activities Board shall be all students in the university. The primary constituency of a Senator representing a university or residential college or school shall be students in that college. The primary constituency of the "freshman senators" shall be the freshman class

Section 3. A student eligible to vote shall be defined as: anyone taking a course at Murray State University, excluding dual-enrolled high school students, faculty, and staff. Student workers and graduate assistants are not considered staff members of Murray State University.




