22	STUDENT SENATE BYLAWS
23	
24	ARTICLE I. NAME AND PURPOSE
25	
26	Section A. The legislative branch of the Student Government Association shall be known
27	as the Murray State University Student Senate.
28	
29	Section B. The Student Senate shall be the governing body of the Student Government
30	Association (hereinafter referred to as S.G.A.) and shall have the power to
31	pass resolutions, bills, rules and to implement and maintain any programs
32	consistent with S.G.A. purpose.
33	
34	ARTICLE II. GOVERNMENT
35	
36	Section A. The Senate membership shall consist of the Executive Council of the S.G.A.,
37	three (3) elected senators from each Academic College OR School of the
38	University, and two (2) "freshman senators," eight (8) senators at-large, and
39	two (2) senators from each Residential Colleges who, along with the
40	members of the executive council, shall have the right to vote.
41	
42	1. The Executive Council of S.G.A. shall consist of the President/Student
43	Regent Executive Vice-President, Vice President of Administration,
44	Vice President of Finance, Chief Justice, and the President of the
45	Residential College Association.
46	2. As stated in the Constitution, the RCA President and Chief Justice are
47	"ex-officio" members of the Executive Council, and do not receive the
48	right to vote.
49	3. The President of S.G.A. shall have the right to vote only in case of a
50	tie.
51	
52	ARTICLE III. ELECTION/APPOINTMENT AND DURATION OF TERM
53	
54	Section A. The Election/Ways and Means Committee shall be responsible for the
55	establishment and enforcement of the rules governing each election.
56	
57	Section B. In the event the Election/Ways and Means Committee
58	Chair is a candidate for office during the time of elections; the President shall
59	appoint a temporary chair of the committee until after the election results

60		have been confirmed.
61		
62	Section C.	All elected or appointed positions shall be organized by the S.G.A., with the
63		exception of R.C.A. positions (excluding the R.C.A. president). Executive and
64		Senator positions shall be elected in the spring semester. All other positions
65		will be elected or appointed according to their respective operating
66		principles.
67		
68	Section D.	All candidates must without exception meet the requirements for the office
69		of their candidacy as declared in the constitution and by-laws.
70		
71	<mark>Section E</mark> .	No member of S.G.A. shall be allowed to serve in two constitutional
72		branches, other than the officers so required by the constitution. Further, no
73		candidates shall appear on the S.G.A. ballot more than once. Nor, shall any
74		candidates be allowed to run for more than one Senate office per election.
75		
76	Section F.	In order to be elected, a candidate must receive a plurality of the votes cast.
77		In case of a tie, a runoff election shall be held within 15 school days.
78		
79	Section G.	No write-in candidates will be accepted.
80		
81	Section H.	All Student Senate positions shall be for one-year terms unless otherwise
82		stated in these by-laws.
83		
84	Section I.	The election results shall be made known to the public no more than 24
85		hours following the election closing.

120	immediately and without obstruction, and all the duties and

123	4. Serve as chair of the Senate in the absence of the President.

125	Activities Board Programming Council.
126	6. Perform all other functions, as defined in the Campus Activities

128	Perform any additional tasks, as assigned by the President.

- 7. Be responsible for preparation and presentation of the S.G.A. budget.

Have completed ACC 200 (Principles of Accounting I or equivalent if transferring from another school) or AGR 333 (Agribusiness Records and Analysis), NLS 502 (Financial Resource Management and Development), FIN 230 (Personal Financial Planning, or MAT 250 (Calculus and Analytical Geometry 1) with the grade of a "C" or better in each class, by the end of the academic term in which he/she is elected. Additionally, required courses may be substituted with a comprehensive skills test established by the Student Government Association. This test will be administered and graded by the Election Ways and Means Chair and/or the Student Government Association Advisor before the mandatory candidates meeting.
- 9. Perform any additional tasks, as assigned by the President.

4. The Vice President of Administration shall:

- 1. Maintain at least a 2.7 G.P.A. on the 4.0 scale.
- 2. Record all Senate, Campus Activities Board, and Executive Council documents. Work with other branches, which coordinate their own documents, to maintain proper records of the organization.
- 3. Maintain SGA membership records.
- 4. Record the minutes of each Senate meeting, C.A.B. and Executive Council meeting.
- 5. Be responsible for publication of official S.G.A. correspondence.
- 6. Perform any additional tasks, as assigned by the President.

5. The Judicial Board Chief Justice shall:

- 1. Maintain at least a 2.7 G.P.A. on the 4.0 scale.
- 2. Serve as an ex-officio member of the Executive Council.
- 3. Provide Judicial Board updates to the Executive Council.
- 4. Provide their interpretation of the constitution, as it relates to the initiatives of the Executive Council.
- 5. Perform all other functions, as defined in the Judicial Board operating principles.
- 6. Perform any additional tasks, as assigned by the President, as so

361		from their respective college/school.
362		2. If the senator presents a verifiable reason to the Executive Council that
363		he/she can not serve on this committee then the other senator
364		representing that college shall serve.
365		3. Student members of the Academic Council shall elect among themselves
366		a Chairperson who will be responsible for a weekly report to the student
367		senate. The attendance policy shall follow that which is outlined in
368		ARTICLE 9: Section A.

378		university colleges, "freshman senators," residential colleges, and the
379		Senators elected at-large from the campus, and the Executive Council of

380 S.G.A. The President of S.G.A. shall only vote in the case of a tie. 381 382 Section B. Senate members must be present at the meetings to vote. 383 384 ARTICLE IX. ABSENCES AND VACANCIES 385 386 Section A. Absences. 387 388 1. Each member of the Senate shall be allowed two (2) unexcused absences 389 per semester. 390 2. Excused absences shall be determined by the President of S.G.A. and the 391 Vice President of Administration. 3. After the second unexcused absence, the Executive Council of S.G.A. 392 must call this member before them and determine if the absences should 393 result in dismissal from the Senate. 394 395 Section B. Vacancies. 396 397 1. All vacancies shall be publicized for a minimum of one academic week. 398 Applications will be accepted from qualified persons interested in the 399 400 positions. The Executive Council shall interview applicants and nominate 401 person(s) to fill vacant office(s). The applicant shall be appointed by 402 receiving approval by a persuasive majority, ninety percent (90%), from 403 the senators present at the following meeting. If the applicant fails to 404 receive ninety percent, then the Senate shall interview the applicants and 405 appoint a person to the fill the vacant office.
