

Important information about Murray State Health Services

Currently, <u>Campus Health Services</u>, located on the 1st floor of Wells Hall (on the Quad side), is operated by Village Medical. Village Medical will no longer operate the Campus Health Services after Friday, October 4, 2024, at 12 noon.

Starting on Monday, October 14, <u>Campus Health Services</u> will be operated by Murray-Calloway County Hospital (MCCH)/Murray Medical Associates (MMA). Campus Health Services will serve as a satellite location for MCCH/MMA and will continue to be located on the 1st floor of Wells Hall (on the Quad side). The hours, effective October 14, will be 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday (closed 12:30 – 1:30 pm for lunch) for the fall and spring semesters. Campus Health Services is available to students, faculty, staff and the campus community. There are designated parking spaces located directly south of the Nash House, on 16th Street, for individuals visiting Campus Health Services.

Campus Health Services will be closed from Friday, October 4, at 12 noon until Monday, October 14, at 8 a.m. for transition purposes. If there is a medical need between these dates, please contact one of the two offices below:

For emergency medical treatment, call 911 or go to the nearest emergency department. MCCH has emergency services located at 803 Poplar Street (the entrance is on 9th Street), Murray, Kentucky.

Allergy shots will be available on Tuesday, October 8, if scheduled in advance with Village Medical. Please schedule at Campus Health Services before 12 noon on Friday, October 4.

Students who are current patients with Village Medical through Campus Health Services may continue their patient experience with Village Medical at 1000 South 12th Street or submit a record request for their records to be transferred to MCCH/MMA to continue to be seen through Health Services. 



Department of Global Languages and Theatre Arts

The Department of Global Languages and Theatre Arts begins its language and theatre season and is excited to announce its October events.

First is our children's show, Snow White by Marjorie Sokoloff, on Saturday, October 5, at 2:30 pm in Robert E. Johnson Theatre. This children's show is for preschool to 4th grade students. The Witch was the fairest one of all first, and she will not be silenced any longer! This updated version of the classic story unveils the villain's perspective, from her tragic childhood to her quest for revenge. So, how did the story really go? Join all seven quirky dwarves, a tongue-tied prince, a sassy mirror, a dancing chicken, and Snow White in a tale about beauty, friendship, and happily-ever-afters with a twist.

We will also perform Steel Magnolias by Robert Harling on October 24-27 in the Wilson Studio Theatre. For tickets, go to Universe.com, Click on Find Events > scroll to Find Events Near You (Murray), or go to our Tickets page at murraystate.edu/theatre.

The action is set in Truvy's beauty salon in Chinquapin, Louisiana, where all the ladies who are "anybody" come to have their hair done. Helped by her eager new assistant, Annelle (who is not sure whether or not she is still married), the outspoken, wise-cracking Truvy dispenses shampoos and free advice to the town's prosperous curmudgeon, Ouiser ("I'm not crazy, I've just been in a bad mood for forty years"); an eccentric millionaire, Miss Clairee, who has a raging sweet tooth; and the local social leader, M'Lynn, whose daughter, Shelby (the prettiest girl in town), is about to marry a "good ole boy." Filled with hilarious repartee and not a few acerbic but humorously revealing verbal collisions, the play moves toward tragedy when, in the second act, the spunky Shelby (who has diabetes) risks pregnancy and forfeits her life. The sudden realization of

their mortality affects the others but also draws on the underlying strength—and love—which give the play and its characters the exceptional quality to make them truly touching, funny, and marvelously amiable company in good times and bad.

On October 25, we will host regional schools in the Curris Center for our annual Global Language Showcase. This regional festival allows language students of all levels to participate in fun, creative events representing a variety of languages and cultures.



Racer Parent Perspective



Midterms and fall break are right around the corner, and students are looking forward to the break! Check in with your student to see how they're doing in their classes, how they're connecting with others socially, and ask if they need anything to enhance their experience. The next two recommendations from Dr. Eric

Kirby's book, Leading Gen Z: Insights and Strategies for Managing, Parenting, and Teaching Generation Z are perfect reminders as we get ready for our students to return home for the break!

- 1. "Align with their interests and preferences: Show genuine interest in their hobbies, music, and social media trends. This strengthens your relationship and keeps you informed about their world, enabling you to offer more relevant and personalized advice." YES! This advice is right on the money. Your student WANTS TO CONNECT WITH YOU! Allowing our kids to share what they like to do is a great way to connect, and it doesn't have to be a one-way exchange. Share what you're interested in too. Maybe since they've been in college you've started a new hobby...include them in your interests! Better yet, plan a trip or activity for fall break that you both will enjoy. You'll forever appreciate the memories you create together.
- 2. "Guide independence with a supportive hand: Encourage autonomy in your Gen Z child by supporting their endeavors and allowing them to make their own decisions (within reason). Provide a safety net of guidance and advice, letting them know you're there when needed." Again, I say YES! It's tough, but we have to loosen the reins a bit and start letting our students make decisions on their own. That's part of the learning process, and where the growth and maturity come from. It's important to be there for our (adult) children if and when they need You'll be rewarded time and time again as you witness their confidence growing!

When I said that students are looking forward to fall break, I meant it. For most, a routine has been established and they're settled. That being said, as the semester has progressed, the workload has increased. Your student may be feeling a little overwhelmed by the work. If we can help, please let us know!
