

Racer Parent Perspective



"It takes courage to grow up and become who you really are." — E.E. Cummings

Today I share the last two of Dr. Kirby's recommendations from Leading Gen Z. I hope the information shared has been helpful, and maybe given you a different perspective to consider. These last two recommendations really drive home the importance of what we do as parents to help our students. I hope you agree.

1. "Encourage critical thinking: Engage them in discussions that challenge them to think critically about various topics, from current events to personal beliefs. This not only strengthens your bond but also prepares them for independent thought and decision-making." This one has been fun for me. Sometimes tough, but fun. I love seeing my kids (now adults) make decisions on their own, and I'm proud of them for staying true to who they are as individuals! You may not agree with the decisions they make, but teaching them the skills to make those decisions on their own is everything. Taking all perspectives into consideration, questioning information, and weighing the outcomes...that's critical thinking, and a skill that will serve them in their education, their career and life.

2. "Be a source of emotional support: Understand and recognize the pressure and challenges faced by Gen Z. Offer a listening ear and emotional support for their concerns and stresses, reinforcing the idea that home is a safe and supportive space." This is another opportunity to practice active listening with your student. Listening without judgement. It isn't easy, but it's necessary to help in building those bonds with your adult child. The pandemic did a number on us all, and the challenges our children have today are vastly different than those we experienced. Murray State University has mental health resources the <u>Counseling Center</u>, the <u>Psychological Center</u>, and <u>TimelyCare</u> if your student needs support from someone who isn't so closely connected.

In the <u>Center for Student Engagement and Success</u>, we're focused on helping students have what they need to be successful, in and out of the classroom.
